Populating ORCID using Google Scholar exports

1) Log into <u>Google Scholar</u> and click on the 'My Profile' link on the top left of the screen. Once logged in you will see your profile and publications that are linked to you in Google Scholar.

2) Once in your profile, in the documents area, then click on the check box next to the publications you wish to export

4) Once you have selected the publication you wish to export, the grey bar will change, and you will now see an export option. Click on the drop-down arrow of the Export box, and select the BibTeX option:

5) This will bring up a page of coding in BibTeX format. If you go up to the 3 dots at the top far right-hand corner, click that then select Save and Share, then Save page as... and then it will give you the option to save this as a text (.txt) file type.

6) You should now have a BibTeX file in your download folder and may wish to save this into a separate drive. You can rename this if you want but you should ensure that the .bib.txt file extension remains, or the file will not work.

7) You then log into your <u>ORCID</u> profile, Start from the 'Works' section on your profile, select +Add, then Add BibTeX.
